The Great Thanksgiving

The Lord be with you. **And also with you.** Lift up your hearts. **We lift them to the Lord.** Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. **It is right to give our thanks and praise.**

It is truly right and our greatest joy to give you thanks and praise, O Lord our God, creator and ruler of the universe. We praise you for saints and martyrs, for the faithful in every age who have followed your Son and witnessed to his resurrection. From every race and tongue, from every people and nation, you have gathered them into your kingdom. You have shown them the path of life and filled them with the joy of your presence. How glorious is your heavenly realm where the multitude of your saints rejoice with Christ. Therefore we praise you, joining our voices with angels and archangels, with prophets, apostles, and martyrs, and with all the faithful of every time and place, who forever sing to the glory of your name:

Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

Accept this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving as a living and holy offering of ourselves, that our lives may proclaim the One crucified and risen. Great is the mystery of faith:


Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again.

Blankets Needed for Migrants: Many of you are aware that the former Marine base at 3034 W. Foster is now being used to house roughly 550 migrants, primarily from Venezuela. Many thanks to all of you who have already been generous in thinking about ways to be helpful and in giving of time and needed items to these families. One of the things we are hearing is that the building is very cold. It is a large space with high ceilings, and it does not seem well-insulated. In an effort to provide some assistance, we are partnering again with the Hollywood-North Park Community Association to collect blankets for the families living there. Please bring new (preferably) and used (if in good shape and recently washed) twin and/or throw-size blankets to the church anytime between now and November 15 so they can be delivered to the building directly. Thank you!

NPCC presents a Taqueria Las Flores Kitchen Pop-up! Jazmin Flores, owner of Taqueria Las Flores, for which we prayed after they experienced a devastating fire, is going to be cooking in our kitchen, making foods for a menu she calls "CONVIVIR"; a Spanish idiom meaning "to experience life together" <u>Pre-orders from this menu</u> will be taken until November 8 (or up to 50 orders, whichever comes first!), and then you will be able to come to church to pick up your food between 5:30 and 6:45 pm on November 10. Quantities are limited! Pre-orders only!

Lay Leaders' Commissioning November 12: We have had a full fall season at NPCC and, with all that has been happening, we have not had time during worship to pray for and commission the lay leaders among us who give so generously and so mindfully to the work of the church. But it's never too late! So, if you are a lay leader in the church, we hope you will make every effort to be present in Sunday morning worship on November 12 for a prayer of commissioning, blessing, and gratitude as we continue together in Kingdom work.

Town Hall and Congregational Meeting to be Held to Discuss Employee Retention Credit Monies Please mark your calendars for Sunday, November 19, and Sunday, December 3, following worship each of those mornings for time to gather as a church family.

Late last winter, North Park Covenant Church (with North Park Church Cooperative Preschool) applied, at the encouragement of the Central Conference Office, for an Employee Retention Credit; monies granted to organizations that were able to maintain their employee count through the duration of the COVID pandemic. We were granted that credit and received checks this summer in the amount of approximately \$200,000. The Executive Council has had a fair amount of discussion on how this money could be divided between the preschool and the church. Further, we held one town hall last spring to discuss the possibilities. It is time, now, for us to make some decisions.

On November 19, there will be a town hall to further discuss how these monies might be divided. There will be no vote at this meeting.

On December 3, we will gather for a brief congregational meeting to vote on the division of that money.

We will call another gathering at a later date to determine together how the church's portion might be used for the glory of God and for our neighbors' good.
