We are currently relying on undesignated reserves to pay our bills; the balance in undesignated reserves is \$22,782.

KICY Salmon Dinner Sunday, October 6, 1 pm Ravenswood Covenant Church



On October 6, Ravenswood Covenant is hosting a meal to raise money for KICY radio station. Fresh Alaskan salmon will be flown in and served, and KICY program director Patty Burchell will give a presentation of the station's ministry. Guests may leave an offering at their plate. This dinner will take place in conjunction with Ravenswood Covenant's annual Offerfest project, of which half of 2024's funds will also go toward KICY's ministry.

KICY broadcasts from Nome, Alaska, and is owned by Arctic Broadcasting Association, which is a 501(c)3 non-profit corporation affiliated with the Evangelical Covenant Church. KICY serves native Alaskan villages throughout western Alaska, as well as the entire Russian Far East. Most of KICY's annual operating budget comes from churches and individual donations, and their staff consists of full- and part-time volunteers.

Since KICY's first sign-on—Easter Sunday, April 17, 1960—it has broadcast the good news of Jesus Christ. They've increased power to 50,000 watts, 24 hours a day, which allows KICY AM 850 the opportunity to send the gospel to places where other forms of media are not readily available. They operate two distinct radio stations, KICY AM 850 & ICY 100.3 FM. While the AM station broadcasts at 50,000 watts and can be heard throughout the entire region, the FM station is programmed for and serves the city of Nome and surrounding communities.
