Neighborhood Prayer in 2024

As we come to the end of both the calendar year and the church year, we are encouraged to pray with our eyes and our ears for our neighborhoods and communities. As we are bombarded with the sights and sounds of Thanksgiving, Advent, and Christmas; and as we journey

to the stable, may we also live with eyes wide open and ears attuned to the cares and needs of our neighbors, that they, too, would come to know Jesus as Lord and Savior of their lives.

But blessed are your eyes, for they see, and your ears, for they hear. Truly I tell you, many prophets and righteous people longed to see what you see, but did not see it and to hear what you hear but did not hear it. - Matthew 13:16-17

Childcare is available in the toddler room (lower level, off the hallway south of the parlors) for the full duration of the worship service for any wee ones ages 0 through 5 needing a place to wiggle and play. We always happily welcome children in the service but recognize that sometimes parents need a break so they can focus on worship.

It takes a village to build a little town! We will begin setting up for Little Town of Bethlehem on Wednesday, December 4, after the Gather dinner. Further set-up will take place on Saturday, December 7, from 9 am to 12 noon. We can use as many volunteers as possible for both of these days. If you plan to participate in the Little Town event on December 8, please be sure to attend either or both of the set-up times. Then, on December 8, please come to church at 3 pm to get your costume and any supplies you might need. Please reach out to <u>Pastor Libby</u> or <u>Lisa Applequist</u> if you have questions or would like to volunteer. Many hands make light and fun work!

There will be a congregational meeting on Sunday, December 8, immediately after church for the purpose of approving the following:

- 1. Additional funding of up to \$75,000 for the additional repairs that are needed on the East Wall in the tower stairwell where there is water damage. The money will come from the Building with Faithfulness funds.
- 2. Approve funding for the replacement of the boiler for the sanctuary building. The current boiler needs to be replaced due to bad heat exchangers. The money for this (\$46,000) will come from undesignated bequests. The repairs to the current boiler will cost almost as much as a new boiler, and the three different companies that have inspected the boiler all recommended purchasing a new, more efficient unit.

Update from Our Treasurer: As of October 31, 2024, offering totals \$483,998 compared to the year-to-date budget of \$545,000 and compared to \$491,274 as of October 31, 2023. To meet the budget, we need \$170,002 of offering in November and December. Total income through October is \$567,716 with total expenses of \$591,929, resulting in a \$24,213 shortfall. In addition to regular monthly expenses to be paid through the end of the year including

salaries, utilities, and supplies, we have budgeted \$15,000 to fund capital improvement reserves, which is not reflected in actual expenses year-to-date.
