





From Pastor Tomas Sanabria, Iglesia del Pacto Evangélico de Albany Park, as a response to the current political policies overwhelming all of the Latino congregations with immigrant members:

Since its founding 53 years ago, our church has been a Spanish-speaking church. But discernment has us now opening a new English-language Sunday service to be 1) a time of worship and service for any believer who does not fear being in the trenches with Latino worshipers, and 2) a secondary service to be supportive of the core Spanish church whose service follows at 11:30 am.

We invite you and friends to help us inaugurate our new English church services every Sunday in February (2, 9, 16, 23) from 9 am to 10:30 am. We will serve a free breakfast from 7:30 - 8:30 am.

Until we attract new worshippers through evangelism, all ministries are available: ushers, worship, music, dance, kitchen, etc. Whether you choose to serve a while or just visit now and then, please share this with friends and family. We are located at 4516 N. Kedzie Avenue.

Exodus 34:29-35 Psalm 99 2 Corinthians 3:12-4:2 Luke 9:28-36, (37-43a) **Congregational Meeting March 2:** On Sunday, March 2, following worship, we will hold a brief congregational meeting in the sanctuary to vote on the Building with Faithfulness tithe options that were pared down through an initial vote at the January 26 Congregational Annual Meeting.
