may be the communion of the body and blood of Christ.
By your Spirit, unite us with the living Christ and with all who are baptized in your name,

As this bread is Christ's body for us, send us out to be the body of Christ in the world.

Lead us, O God, by the power of your Spirit to live as the Lord requires: to do justice, to love kindness, and to walk humbly with you, our God.
